Federica Montseny Susanna Tavera, 2005 Destacada anarquista, Federica Montseny fue la primera mujer que llegó a ministra en la historia de España, además de ser una escritora revolucionaria y una intelectual comprometida. Sus transgresoras ideas sobre el sufragio universal o sobre la interrupción voluntaria del embarazo y sus propuestas en materia de sanidad levantaron polémica y la han convertido en uno de los personajes más interesantes aunque desconocidos de la política en el periodo republicano. La historiadora Susanna Tavera se documenta en fuentes inéditas para descubrirnos la apasionante vida de una mujer adelantada a su tiempo.

The volume can be used in both undergraduate college courses and in postgraduate university seminars.

50 mujeres españolas extraordinarias Joaquín de la Santa Cinta, Este libro contiene las historias de 50 Mujeres Españolas Extraordinarias que, por su carácter y esfuerzo, fueron capaces de realizar hechos y hazañas poco o nada conocidas y mucho menos recordadas. La Historia de España ha sido escrita por y para los hombres, olvidando, e incluso vilipendiando, a aquellas mujeres que rompieron moldes, realizaron gestas o trabajos que la sociedad asignaba a los hombres y se rebelaron contra las normas y costumbres sociales de la época en la que les tocó vivir. A pesar de ello, algunas pocas, muy pocas, están en la historia, aunque su memoria esté totalmente perdida, o casi. El grupo lo componen mujeres que en el siglo IV viajaron a los confines del mundo conocido; fueron reinas como Urraca I de Castilla, Berenguela; luchadoras como la Dama de Arintero, Inés Suárez, María la Bailaora y la monja alférez; defensoras de los derechos de mujeres como Teresa de Cartagena, María de Zayas; la primera y, hasta ahora, única almirante de la Armada Española, la única mujer Virrey en la historia; la primera mujer que descendió sola el curso del río Amazonas de los Andes peruanos hasta su desembocadura para reunirse con su marido después de 20 años separados; las primeras universitarias y doctoras, periodistas, locutoras de radio, diputadas en Cortes, ministras del Gobierno de España, aviadoras, ingenieras y arquitectas, olímpicas, caídas en combate en Afganistán o impulsoras de las ciencias españolas. Además de la mujer cuya vida es un cuento de hadas, Anita Delgado, que pasó de cantar en un café madrileño a principios del siglo XX a ser S.A. Maharani Prem Kaur de Kapurthala. Sin olvidar a la Duquesa de La Victoria, María del Carmen Angoloti, la Dama de Sanidad Militar que, por orden de la reina Victoria Eugenia, acudió con un grupo pequeño de mujeres a cuidar de los heridos en Melilla hace ahora un siglo. Aquella mujer de la que se puede leer en el Diario Sesiones de Cortes, Congreso de Diputados, del día 27 de octubre de 1921, las palabras del diputado del PSOE, Sr. Prieto "...Sin embargo conozco en esta guerra un heroísmo ante el cual me hincaría de rodillas, y es el de unas damas que, sea cual fuere su alcurnia, una conciencia honrada como la mía no puede pasar en silencio. Me refiero a ese grupo pequeño, diminuto, ínfimo, capitaneado por esa heroína que se llama Duquesa de la Victoria. Es el único heroísmo español del cual he sido testigo, el único que me siento con valor para exaltar aquí; pero con la exaltación tiene que ir la honda lamentación, entre lágrimas, de que sea un puñado tan escaso, cinco, seis, ocho mujeres, las que andan atendiendo a los heridos, clavando los féretros, amortajando los cadáveres. ..."

Seis años de mi vida (1939-1945) Federica Montseny, 2020-01-24 En 1939 se produjo la entrada en Francia de medio millón de personas –hombres, mujeres, ancianos, niños– huyendo de la metralla y de las persecuciones fascistas. Todas las carreteras de Francia, desde la frontera hasta las primeras ciudades, a lo largo de toda la línea de los Pirineos, fueron cubiertas por esa masa humana, en la que se mezclaban civiles y militares, heridos e inválidos, colonias infantiles conducidas por maestras y maestros. Fue algo indescriptible, que jamás podrá ser narrado con toda su magnitud, con los contornos apocalípticos que revistió para cuántos lo vivimos. Federica Montseny, primera mujer ministra de un gobierno en la Historia de España, vivió intensamente la lucha social catalana anterior a la guerra hasta convertirse en destacada cabecilla de la CNT. En el momento de estallar el conflicto en 1936 es ya una de las figuras más respetadas del movimiento libertario, por lo que fue llamada por Largo Caballero para ocupar la cartera de Sanidad y Asistencia Social, si bien no tuvo tiempo de llevar a cabo sus ambiciosos planes para crear lugares de acogida para la infancia, centros de atención para embarazadas sin recursos, programas de inclusión en la vida laboral de personas con discapacidad... Acabada la guerra civil pasa a Francia, refugiada junto a miles de hombres y mujeres exiliados y pasando sus mismas penurias. Es perseguida por los alemanes y por la policía española, que solicita sin éxito su extradición para ser fusilada. Pero no podrá evitar otros sufrimientos, como ella misma nos explica en estas páginas testimoniales marcadas por una profunda sensibilidad entremezclada con una activa militancia. Acabada la Segunda Guerra Mundial se establece definitivamente en Toulouse, donde residirá con su compañero Germinal Esgleas y sus tres hijos: Vida, Germinal y Blanca. Siguió trabajando por sus ideas, publicando y dirigiendo periódicos anarquistas como CNT y Espoir y realizando viajes por Suecia, México, Canadá, Inglaterra e Italia. Regresó a España en 1977 mas, desengañada, eligió morir en la ciudad que generosamente la había acogido en los peores momentos de su vida, Toulouse.
